


Grade 6 Transition Day

READING AT HOME

Reading to your children. They are never too old to be read to.

Reading and sharing stories can:

- help your child get to know sounds, words and language, and develop early literacy skills.
- learn to value books and stories.
- spark your child's imagination and stimulate curiosity.
- help develop your child's brain, ability to focus, concentration, social skills and communication skills.

Picture story books – ask your child to choose some from our library. Re-read favourites often.

Find a favourite place to read to your child daily

- At bedtime
- Snuggled up on the couch with you
- In a tent (a sheet draped over some chairs is fun.)
- Under the doona with a torch



Before long you will probably find them in this spot and waiting for you. This will create lasting memories for you and your child.

Chapter Books. Older children might enjoy a novel that is read to the whole family. Reading one chapter a night gives them something to look forward to. There are many chapter books to choose from depending on age and interest. Your child might have a favourite author, you might have a favourite from your childhood, or ask their teacher for some suggestions. Ask your child to borrow from our library.


Alternatively, sign them up at the town library. There are some great reads there as well.

We sometimes assume that once they are independent readers that we no longer need to read to them. 'Reading to' opens up conversation and grows relationships. (Even adults like to be read to – think about how many adults listen to audio books.)

A children's story that can only be enjoyed by children is not a good children's story in the slightest.




