New Costume Lending Library initiative



Book Day 2023

We are celebrating Book Day on Friday 25th August. We would love you to get involved by dressing up as your favourite book character on the day!

Don't have a costume? No worries, see the great lending initiative below.



Inclusive Access: The initiative aims to provide equal opportunities for all families in the community to participate in book week events, regardless of financial resources. The Costume Lending Library eliminates the embarrassment some children may feel about not having a costume, ensuring everyone can fully immerse themselves in the characters and stories they love.

Collaborative Partnership: United Way Glenelg partnered with Portland Aluminium and collaborated with students from Portland Bay School to acquire a collection of top-notch, longlasting costumes and accessories. The students actively participated in the costume selection process, making thoughtful choices to cater to a wide range of individuals.

Community Impact: The Costume Lending Library will be housed at Glenelg Libraries and shared across each Glenelg Library location, including Heywood and Casterton, to reach rural remote children. The initiative aims to bring the community together by promoting children's participation in book week events. Through various promotional channels like welfare coordinators, media releases, radio advertising, and social media posts, United Way Glenelg aims to make a significant impact on the lives of children and families in the community, fostering inclusivity and engagement.

The Costume Lending Library is open to all residents who are library members, providing them with the opportunity to borrow costumes.

Our Hands on Learning team have been keeping busy baking super delicious cupcakes and building fences among other things!

Carrot cupcakes with maple frosting

Ingredients

Carrot cupcakes with maple frosting

- 1/2 cup (125ml) vegetable oil
- 3 eggs
- 1 1/2 cup (225g) self-raising flour
- 1 cup (220g) firmly packed light brown sugar
- · 2 teaspoon mixed spice
- 2 cup (480g) firmly packed coarsely grated carrot

Maple frosting

- · 30 gram (1 ounce) butter, softened
- 80 gram (2½ ounces) cream cheese, softened
- · 2 tablespoon pure maple syrup
- 1 1/4 cup (200g) icing (confectioners') sugar

Method

Carrot cupcakes with maple frosting

Preheat oven to 180° C/ 350° F. Line 16 holes of two 12-hole (%-cup/80ml) muffin pans with % paper cases.

Stir oil, eggs, sifted flour, sugar and spice in medium bowl until combined. Stir in carrot. Divide mixture into paper cases.

Bake cakes about 30 minutes. Stand cakes in pan 5 minutes before turning, top-side up, onto wire rack to cool.

Meanwhile, to make maple frosting, beat butter, cream cheese and syrup in small bowl with electric mixer until light and fluffy; gradually beat in sifted icing sugar until

frosting is spreadable.

Spread frosting over cupcakes.
