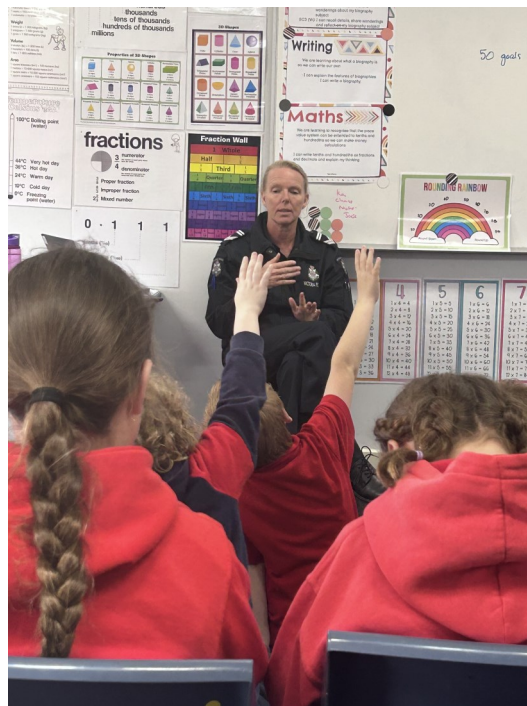
# Cyber Safety Sessions
