Some of our students at Bundarra have been training in preparation for the upcoming 3 Bays running festival on Sunday 5th November. Students will run a combined 42.2km on Sunday morning, representing our school in the process. Our relay team will depart the Portland Basketball stadium at 8:15am, before heading out to the Bridgewater lakes, past the airport and down the Cashmore straight, before returning to the finish line in front of the Portland Angling Club.

We encourage students participating within this event to ensure they continue to train hard outside of school hours, to best prepare themselves for this event. Further information will be sent home with individual students.

Bike Education

Bike Education will once again be taught at Bundarra Primary School during week 10 of Term 4. Students in Grades 3 and 4, will have the opportunity to upskill themselves within their road safety knowledge and bike riding skills. Aurore Couynilh

Deakin Aurore is a University PhD student. She will speak about her research work on the gannets Australasian at Point Danger, which focuses on the movement ecology of individuals in two breading sites in Victoria, including the



Point Danger colony. The talk will focus on the effects of environmental factors on the behaviour of Point Danger's gannets.

In this talk, Bella will dive into the Great Southern Reef and its recent identity surge, and why this marine environment is so unique. She'll then discuss the importance of supporting our children to connect with this incredible environment, offering practical strategies and ideas.

Bernard Wallace

Bernard has a deep interest in the rich history of Portland and Victoria's South West. He has published a range of books including Mary MacKillop's Portland Years -



1862-1866. Place names of Portland and the Glenelg Shire, Significant Women of Portland and Victoria's South West, and The Whaling Era at Portland Bay. In this presentation he will consider the history of whaling at Portland Bay, from the establishment of bay whaling in 1831 through to the last local whale kill in 1868. He will highlight the critical economic and general impact of whaling on Portland in the early years of European settlement.
