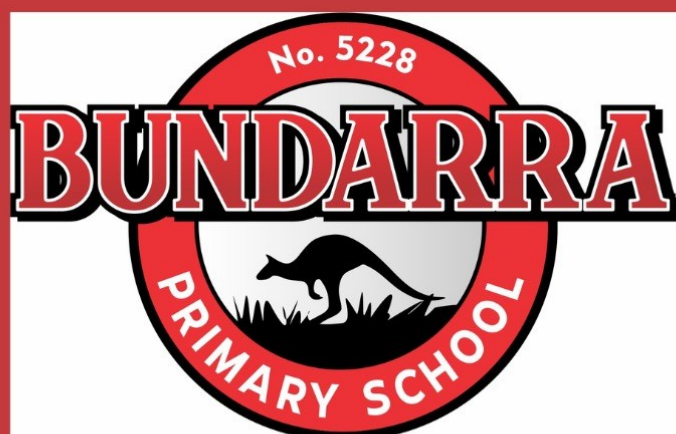
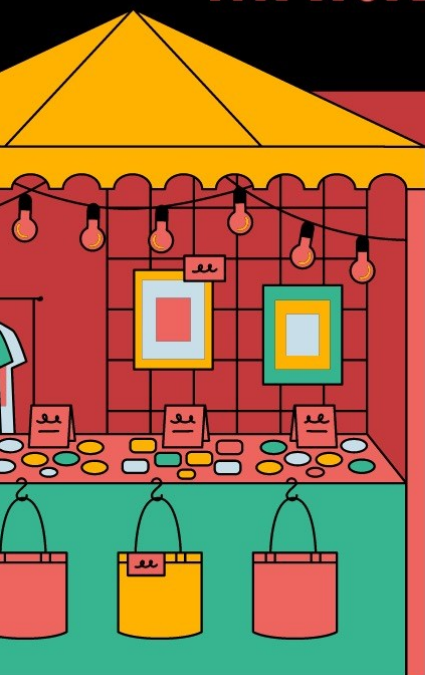

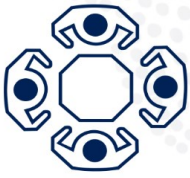

Managing Disappointment and Celebrating Effort – 5 Minute read

We've just had our sports day! From our side we saw some great successes but often our students and parents see it a different way. Those who were there can be tempted to compare your child to others and those who weren't, may get a varied report on the day.

It is important to remember that winning isn't the goal here – having a go is the most important element. Ask your child what they thought of their effort – also ask what they liked and what they struggled with. Athletics events aren't suited to everyone but the process of compete / improve contains so many life lessons. The Portland Little Athletics Club promotes the concept of aiming for personal bests rather than winning against others. Consider a season of this at the end of the year.

There are some constants that help students move through and learn from these days.

In summary these are –

Empathise – re-assure them that they tried their best and that they will continue to improve.

Teach – our students will understand that results come from effort and improvement can be taught. There is much more to this too. Let them know that there will be times when they are the best at something until.... they meet someone faster, stronger, higher etc...

Help your child manage expectations – it's normal to have a gap between what you think will happen and what actually happens... we have this all the time as adults. Present several options about what might happen and talk around those.

Keep believing in your child – they will appreciate the support, love and guidance.

Give them some control – disappointments are motivation to make things better. Allow your child to process the situation and then talk about how to improve things.
